**KSC/CCAS MEDICAL CLINICS—HOURS OF OPERATION:** There are three medical clinics at KSC/CCAS:

Occupational Health Facility (OHF) - KSC Industrial Area (SW corner of 2nd Street and C Avenue, Bldg. M6-495)

Launch Area Clinic (LAC) - KSC Launch Area (located in the Multifunction Facility (MFF) Bldg. K6-1145, next to the cafeteria)

Cape Area Clinic (CAC) - CCAS Industrial Area (NE corner of Industry Road & Hangar Road, Bldg. 49635)

The three clinics are open to all KSC/CCAS employees for job-related medical examinations and emergency medical treatments. Hours of operation are:

**ATTENTION ALL CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES REPRESENTED BY AFGE LOCAL 2498:** Employees represented by AFGE Local 2498 are advised of their right to union representation at any examination of them, in the unit, by a representative of the employer, in connection with an investigation if: (1) The employee reasonably believes that the examination may result in disciplinary action against the employee, and (2) the employee requests representation. This right is conferred by Section 7114 (a) (2) (B) and (3) of Chapter 71, Title 5, U.S.C., and is also contained in Article 4, Section 2, of the Negotiated Agreement. Under Article 5, Section 3, of the Agreement, the Union also has the right to be represented at any formal discussion between representatives of the employer and unit employees, or their representatives, concerning grievances, personnel policies or practices, or conditions of employment. 
