NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK—FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: We all know what makes those doughnuts and french fries taste so good—FAT. But, did you know that it's a special kind of fat known as trans fat? Although delicious, trans fat is even more harmful to you than saturated fat because it increases the level of LDL cholesterol (the bad cholesterol) in your blood, which, in turn, increases our risk of heart disease. Under the new rules proposed by the FDA, the listing for saturated fat will have to include the amount of trans fat, noted with an asterisk, that has been added to the amount of saturated fat. A footnote at the bottom of the label will indicate the number of grams per serving. Trans fat is mostly found in foods containing hydrogenated oil. Hydrogenation is the process of turning liquid oil into a solid to protect against spoiling. Stick margarine is one of the most common sources of trans fat. (JJ-C)

Please note that the LAC is the only facility open 24 hours-a-day, 7 days-a-week. It is available for all work shifts and should be the primary clinic for KSC/CCAS on second and third shifts and weekends. **For any medical emergency at anytime, anywhere on KSC or CCAS, dial 911.** (JJ-C)

If not approved for specific applications, electronic images of the NASA Logo ("worm") and Insignia ("meatball") should be removed from computer systems. (FF-S2-A)
