SMOKING CESSATION BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT GROUPS: SGS/CHS Medical offers smoking cessation behavioral support groups for KSC/CCAFS personnel who wish to quit smoking. The groups are led by a physician, the employee assistance counselor, and other health education professionals. The physician prescribes Zyban (oral medication-bupropion) which has been shown to be a very effective adjunct to the nicotine patch for those willing to quit.
