SMOKING CESSATION BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT GROUPS: SGS/CHS Medical offers smoking cessation behavioral support groups for KSC/CCAFS personnel who wish to quit smoking. The groups are led by a physician, the employee assistance counselor, and other health education professionals. The physician prescribes Zyban (oral medication-bupropion) which has been shown to be a very effective adjunct to the nicotine patch for those willing to quit. Groups convene every Tuesday from 7:30 a.m. - 8:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon; and, 2:30 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. to enable times for all shifts.
