**SMOKING CESSATION BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT GROUPS:** SGS/CHS Medical offers smoking cessation behavioral support groups for KSC/CCAFS personnel who wish to quit smoking. The groups are led by a physician, the employee assistance counselor, and other health education professionals. The physician prescribes Zyban (oral medication-bupropion) which has been shown to be a very effective adjunct to the nicotine patch for those willing to quit. Groups convene every Tuesday from 7:30 a.m. – 8:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon; and, 2:30 p.m. – 3:30 p.m. to enable times for all shifts. **NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK—FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS:** Some people think that they should cut sugar out of their diets to prevent weight gain. You'll be happy to know that leaving sugar out of your diet is not healthy. In fact, it's virtually impossible not to eat sugar. Many healthy foods, such as milk, fruits, and vegetables, contain natural sugars. However, certain conditions may require severely restricting sugar intake. A common misconception is that sugar makes you fat. By itself, sugar contains only four calories per gram, just like other carbohydrate-rich foods. The foods containing sugar that you would want to limit would be high-fat foods like doughnuts and ice cream. The combination of sugar and fat is what can cause weight gain, not solely the sugar. The recommended dietary allowance (RDA) for sugar intake should be limited to no more than 20 percent of your daily caloric intake. (TA-C2)
