"The use of computer file NASA Insignias to custom design stationery provides opportunities for image manipulation and standards degradation which will adversely reflect the professional image of the Agency." If not approved for specific applications, electronic images of the NASA Logo ("worm") and Insignia ("meatball") should be removed from computer systems. (TA-E1)

OIG: The Office of the Inspector General is the focal point within NASA for conducting audits and investigations to promote economy and efficiency and to prevent and detect fraud and abuse in NASA programs and operations. The OIG receives and investigates complaints or information about inefficiencies, mismanagement, or gross waste of funds; possible violations of law, rules, or regulations by NASA employees, contractors, or others; or substantial and specific danger to the public health and safety. The Inspector General will not disclose the identity of a person who provides such information without that person's permission, unless the Inspector General determines that disclosure is unavoidable during the course of investigation. NASA employees are protected by law from reprisal for making complaints or disclosing information to the Inspector General.
