Diabetes can cause complications such as heart disease, kidney failure, nerve damage, blindness and deterioration of the blood vessels. Motorists are reminded to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians crossing the roadway in a marked crosswalk when the pedestrian is on the half of the roadway the vehicle is traveling, or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely as to be in danger. SHUTTLE BUS CAUTION: Passengers exiting and crossing in front of Shuttle Buses are in danger of being struck by oncoming vehicles passing the stopped Shuttle Buses. Passengers are cautioned to be alert for oncoming traffic, and vehicle operators should use extreme caution when passing stopped Shuttle Buses and yield to pedestrians. (TA)

INSPECTOR GENERAL: The Office of Criminal Investigations (OCI) is the investigative arm of the NASA Inspector General (IG). The OCI is an independent entity and reports directly to Roberta Gross, the NASA IG, in Washington D.C. The primary mission of this component is to conduct criminal and civil investigations of reported or suspected fraudulent acts by employees, contractors, and others relating to the administration of NASA contracts and programs. Although emphasis is placed on major procurement fraud, (particularly allegations of defective/substandard parts, mischarging, kickbacks, bid rigging, and research fraud), investigations are also conducted of theft, conflict of interest, environmental and hazardous waste violations, health care fraud, and computer related crimes. OCI also provides fraud briefings for Government and contractor employees that are designed to highlight potential risks concerning fraud and related matters. Suspected violations can be reported by calling 867-4714 locally, the toll free Hotline at 1-800-424-9183, or by writing NASA Inspector General, P. O. NASA/JBOSC OUTBOUND SHIPMENTS: To help ensure that all users of the JBOSC Shipping Department have their requirements met, the following procedure must be adhered to: Shipments processed through the JBOSC Shipping Department are for official government business only. Personal shipments are not authorized. All shipments must be accompanied by a properly completed shipping request document (KSC Form 7-248 or DD-1149). Carrier freight bills without the proper KSC forms will not be accepted. Shipments involving hazardous materials must have a Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) or other technical data sheet. Small priority/overnight shipments, including letters, must be received in the JBOSC Shipping Department no later than 2 p.m. or they will be processed on the following workday. Large priority shipments and/or shipments requiring extensive packaging must be received at least 48 hours prior to the required date at destination. Government property tagged items need to be routed through the proper Property Control Office before requesting the shipment and/or, if required, accompanied by a copy of a property custodian's approved KSC Form 1602. If you have any questions or require further information, call the JBOSC Shipping Section at 867-3501 or 867-7998. (TA-E1)

KSC LOCATOR: Personnel at KSC are reminded, when submitting KSC Form 13-58 (Employee Locator Information) to KSC-Locator, to verify all information including the telephone directory information block. Monthly updates to the Locator printouts should be complete. This includes the "Telephone Directory" column. The letter "T" in this column indicates that the name appears in the telephone directory. Home phone numbers will not be printed in the telephone directory unless a signed Form 13-58 is submitted. (TA-E1)
