NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK—FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: Is hypertension a health concern for you or someone in your family? If you're one of the fifty million Americans who has high blood pressure, you may want to know about some dietary changes that may reduce your blood pressure. Results of the DASH (Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension) trial found that changing food intake can change blood pressure readings. Researchers compared three different eating plans for effect on blood pressure. The outcome showed the greatest reduction was in the group consuming nine servings of fruits and vegetables, at least two servings of low-fat dairy products and only 27% of calories from fat—a response that's as good as many drug therapies. Start changing your intake by focusing on increasing servings of fruits and vegetables. One serving is one-half cup mixed fruit or cooked vegetables, one piece of fruit, or one cup of raw leafy vegetables. (TA-C2)

MAMMOGRAMS AT KSC: The Women's Center for Radiology will offer mammograms to women 35 years of age and older and for women younger than 35 with doctor's orders. The mammograms are offered on a "Low Dose Unit" by a certified technologist and are read by a Board Certified Radiologist. A video presentation of breast self-exam is included in the 30-minute procedure. Services will be available to NASA civil servants in conjunction with the Federal Employees Health Program (FEHP) physical exam. Services are available to all other employees at a charge of \$60, payable at the time of services by cash or check. Insurance forms will be provided upon request.
