## OFFICIAL

**FEHB HEALTH FAIR:** Mark your calendars—this is an event not to be missed! **November 15, 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., in the HQ building Lobby and Elevator areas. Don't know what plan to select?** This year we will have a special guest at our Health Fair—Lisa Childs from **PlanSmartChoice!** Some of you have already used this service available at the OPM website. **What is it?** It's a program which requires a little of your time and some personal information. It will provide you with the health benefits plan best suited to your needs! You can purchase **Supplemental Benefits** for dental, eye care, hearing and vitamins through your FEHB Carrier. These are not offered by HMO's for obvious reasons. However, you don't get them for free—you have to pay for the supplemental benefits you select out of your own pocket—no Government monies here! If you check the pamphlets provided by your carrier, you will see ONE page dedicated to these Supplemental Benefits. **Insufficient dental care—need help?** We have made arrangements for a representative of **CIGNA Dental** to attend our health fair. Once again, these costs are yours alone—no monies from Uncle Sam here either. Ann Shisler will be happy to provide you with information concerning their plans. **Humana Enrollees—Be Aware!** By now, you should have received a letter at your home address from Humana explaining to you that effective January 14, 2001, Humana is withdrawing from the FEHB Program. In order for you to maintain health care benefits, you **must** enroll in another plan! If you do not do so during the open season, you will have **no health insurance** in the coming year! You shall continue to be covered under Humana until midnight, January 13, 2001. Effective January 14, 2001 you must have another health carrier. If for some reason between now and then you are told you are not insured—**please** contact me immediately! **GEHA members**—Starting 2001, GEHA will offer **2 plan options**—standard and high. Their rates and plan brochure are already available on line at [www.geha.com](http://www.geha.com) <<http://www.geha.com>>. Please **be sure** the plan code you are enrolled in is the one you choose to be in next year! **For all plans**—be sure to check their 2001 brochures and **read** the changes in Plans effective for 2001. This generally appears within the first 10 pages of the pamphlet. Per directions from OPM, this year's pamphlets will be much more easily understood by employees as they have been directed to print them in "plain language." (BA-B)

**FEHB PREMIUM CONVERSION:** Now that we all know what "premium conversion" is and almost **99%** of us chose to participate, I wanted to remind you that the **FEHB Open Season** (November 13 to December 11, 2000) is the only opportunity you have to make an election change (other than having a "life event.") If you chose not to participate in the Premium Conversion during the initial election period in October and want to participate with the next tax year—you **must** make this election during the **FEHB Open Season** between November 13 and December 11! Election/Waiver forms (KSC Form 13-294) are available at KSC Electronic forms. An **Employee Services Office** table will be set-up at the "Fair" on November 15. At this site, we will have Premium Conversion Forms available for those who want to make a change, Employee Express and TSP information. (BA-B)

**FEDERAL EMPLOYEE HEALTH OPEN SEASON:** The open-enrollment period this year is from November 13 to December 11. If you do nothing, your coverage will continue in your current plans. If you do switch plans, you must enroll during **Open Season**. Coverage will be effective January 14, 2001. You can not be turned down or denied benefits because of any preexisting health conditions, including pregnancy, heart condition, etc. (BA-B)

**FEHB GUIDES AND RATES** The health premiums will be going up—yes, again. The **2001 FEHB Guide** with rates is available on-line at [www.opm.gov/insure](http://www.opm.gov/insure) <<http://www.opm.gov/insure>>. Click on the green "FEHB" box on the left. On the next page, click on the words "rates tables" in the little blue box on the right. Make sure you review the **NON-POSTAL RATES!** Because a very few Guides will be distributed in hard copy by OPM, we recommend you utilize the website for information. (BA-B)

**NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK—FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS:** Gluten intolerance is an intestinal disorder that results from difficulty in digesting the protein in wheat, barley and rye. Gluten intolerance can cause weight loss, loss of appetite, abdominal cramps, and, in children, poor growth. Another problem is that gluten intolerance results in poor vitamin and mineral absorption from food. Treating gluten intolerance means avoiding any foods that are made from wheat, barley, and rye. Switching to corn, rice, soy, tapioca and potato starch provides alternatives to flour. If you think you, or a member of your family, have gluten intolerance, check with a doctor before making any dietary changes. If you are diagnosed as gluten intolerant, a registered dietitian can help you develop an appropriate eating plan. (TA-C2)

**SICK LEAVE AND FAMILY/FRIENDLY LEAVE—DOCTOR'S CERTIFICATE:** Reminder to supervisors and employees: A doctor's certificate (SF-71), or an individual note signed by the physician, is normally required for sick leave absences of more than 3 days. Employees, supervisors, and timekeepers should be aware that time and attendance cards must be initialed in cases where a doctor's certificate is not required. (BA-B)

**EXCESS GOVERNMENT PROPERTY:** All excess government property must be turned in to the NASA Property Disposal Officer at the Reutilization, Recycling and Marketing facility on Ransom Road. No other location is authorized to retain the government's idle property. This includes expendable items, as well as tagged equipment. **TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER PROGRAM:** The main purpose of NASA's Technology Transfer Program is to transfer new technology to commercial organizations for ultimate benefit to the general public. The new technology items so transferred are often referred to as "Space Spinoffs." KSC and contractor employees are urged to participate in this important program by reporting their items of new technology. Such items may include any new or improved technique, tool, computer program, management systems or scientific data. KSC or contractor employees whose items qualify for publication in NASA Tech Briefs will receive a \$350 award. New Technology items should be reported on NASA Form 1679 to the KSC Technology Transfer Officer, Dave Makufka, YA-C1. **RECORDS RETENTION/DISPOSITION:** Each office which maintains NASA records, including NASA owned/contractor-held records, will use as many of the categories in NPG 1441.1 (as revised) as necessary to cover the disposition of records in their custody. Destruction and retention periods must conform to the authorized periods. Direct questions on categories, disposition, etc., to your organizational Records Control Officer or call the Records Manager, 867-4540, for information. (TA-E1)

**GRAPHICS/PUBLICATIONS:** Before you begin any work for publication, consult the JBOSC Graphics Department. According to the print shop, approximately three jobs per week have to be reworked because of problems with alignments, reductions, and postscript formats. By consulting with JBOSC Graphics first, you will eliminate wasted time and effort to rework your project. Graphics will ensure your artwork is produced efficiently and is suitable for reproduction. Graphics has electronic transfer capability, a proven method for first quality prints directly from the original, compared to low density reproductions from copied artwork. **MESSENGER ENVELOPES (STANDARD FORMS 65 B & C) USERS:** All offices are reminded that excess messenger envelopes should be returned to the Forms Warehouse, through the mail and distribution system, for reissue. The appropriate mailcode to use is "Forms Warehouse." (TA-E1)

**USE OF FEDERAL PROPERTY:** There are statutory and regulatory prohibitions against the use of Federal property, facilities, and equipment for personal purposes. These prohibitions apply to such items as Government vehicles, office supplies, FTS (Federal Telecommunications Systems), Datafax, computers and network capabilities, reproduction equipment, tools, and a variety of utility and other items. This also applies to equipment provided by the Government for contractor use and to items issued to the Government. Employees have a positive duty to protect and conserve such items and other property entrusted to them. (BA-B)

**MISUSE OF OFFICE COPIER PAPER:** Paper delivered to the Lanier copiers must not be used for any purpose other than making copies on Lanier copiers. The costs of the machine, maintenance, and all other supplies (staplers, toner, etc.) are included in the cost of office copy paper; this paper is more expensive than paper issued for typing, fax machines, or laser printers. Paper for typing, faxing, and laser printers should be requisitioned from your Logistics Service Center (NASA/SGS only), under Stock No. 7530-01-335-2623. **PEDESTRIAN SAFETY:** Pedestrians crossing roadways on Kennedy Space Center are reminded to yield the right-of-way to all vehicles when crossing the roadway at a point not within a marked crosswalk. Motorists are reminded to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians crossing the roadway in a marked crosswalk when the pedestrian is on the half of the roadway the vehicle is traveling, or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely as to be in danger.
