NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: Colds got you down? Tired of fighting that stuffy nose feeling? Have you checked your nutrition lately? During the cold and flu season everyone is looking for the cure-all. While it may not be a cure-all, vitamin C can help fight colds. Recent research has found that people who consume vitamin C rich foods when a cold starts, get rid of the cold sooner. Whether you have a cold or not, getting enough vitamin C can help your overall nutritional health. Vitamin C, along with other antioxidants, may help reduce the risk of heart disease and certain forms of cancer—so check out your intake. Vitamin C rich foods include the obvious oranges and grapefruits (which are now in season), but also include broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, tomatoes, green peppers, strawberries, potatoes and cantaloupe. 
SICK LEAVE AND FAMILY/FRIENDLY LEAVE—DOCTOR'S CERTIFICATE: Reminder to supervisors and employees: A doctor's certificate (SF-71), or an individual note signed by the physician, is normally required for sick leave absences of more than 3 days. Employees, supervisors, and timekeepers should be aware that time and attendance cards must be initialed in cases where a doctor's certificate is not required. (BA-B)

EXCESS GOVERNMENT PROPERTY: All excess government property must be turned in to the NASA Property Disposal Officer at the Reutilization, Recycling and Marketing facility on Ransom Road. No other location is authorized to retain the government's idle property. This includes expendable items, as well as tagged equipment.
