EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATIONS: Employees have the right to join, or refrain from joining, employee unions. NASA recognizes the right of its employees to form, join, and assist any employee organization, or to refrain from any such activity, and to exercise these rights freely and without penalty or reprisal. This right also extends to participation in the management of the employee organization and to acting as an employee organizational representative, except where such activity would result in a conflict of interest with the official duties of an employee. (BA-B)

LEAVE ADMINISTRATION: Properly managing the use of annual and sick leave is your responsibility. Except for emergencies, you are expected to request leave in advance and obtain your supervisor's approval. In cases of emergency absence, call in and notify your supervisor of the circumstances as soon as possible after the start of the workday, but no later than 4 hours after the beginning of the workday. Failure to properly request and obtain approval of leave may result in the absence being charged to "Absence Without Leave" and could also lead to disciplinary action. Those who are earning annual leave above maximum accumulations limits must plan use of annual leave to avoid loss of one or more days at the end of the year. (BA-B).

SECURITY NOTICE: Florida State Statute 316.1975, Unattended Motor Vehicles, states: "no person driving or in charge of any motor vehicle except a licensed delivery truck, or other delivery vehicle while making deliveries, shall permit it to stand unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, and removing the key." Do not leave the engine running in your unattended vehicle, at any time. (TA-E2)

FEDERAL EMPLOYEE HEALTH BENEFITS FOR MILITARY RETIREES: CHAMPUS coverage for military retirees is automatically transferred from CHAMPUS to Medicare coverage upon attaining the Medicare eligibility, at age 65. Employees have 31 days from the date of loss of CHAMPUS to enroll in a Federal Employees Health Benefit (FEHB) plan. Military retirees who are thinking about retiring from civilian service before reaching Medicare eligibility are reminded: to have FEHB coverage as retiree, an employee must be enrolled at the time of retirement; to insure coverage, they should enroll in an FEHB plan that takes effect before the retirement date elected. To keep FEHB after retirement, employees must be enrolled for at least 5 years; and coverage under CHAMPUS counts towards eligibility to carry FEHB into retirement. EMPLOYEES PLANNING FOR RETIREMENT: To make tentative annuity computations, verify creditable service, and process an application for retirement, employees considering retirement should assure that all military and civilian service has been properly documented in their personnel records. Although dates of military service may have been previously recorded and verified, these dates should be reverified so there will be no delay in the receipt of annuity checks. Employees who have had active military service should submit to Sharon Lowry, Retirement Counselor, Personnel Office Benefits Team (BA-B), copies of their military discharge papers, DD 214, or other documents showing the beginning and ending dates of active service. Employees who do not ensure that all active duty military service is properly documented may experience a delay in the receipt of full annuity payments from OPM upon retirement from civil service.
