FACILITY EVACUATION PROCEDURES FOR EMPLOYEES WITH DISABILITIES: All employees should familiarize themselves with standard KSC evacuation procedures. Employees in need of evacuation assistance should also familiarize themselves with the following procedure from the NASA Fire and Rescue Office: **Facility Evacuation Procedures for Employees with Disabilities:** The NASA Fire and Rescue Office advocates the "area of refuge" concept for employee evacuation of multi-story facilities. This effort will take lots of money and a long time to accomplish. In the interim, personnel evacuating facilities who cannot use the stairs for rapid evacuation should go to the center of the facility near the elevator and wait for the arriving firefighters to come get them and take them down the elevator. If fire or smoke hampers the access to the elevators, emergency evacuation chairs are provided throughout the multi-story facilities for use in an emergency. Supervisors should advise all their employees of the location of the nearest emergency evacuation chair, and appoint individuals to assist employees who cannot use the stairs. Again, the chairs should only be used in an emergency, where fire and smoke will not allow you to reach the elevator for fire department assistance. As a last resort, **911** may be called to inform responding fire fighters of your location. Questions can be directed to Michael B. Stevens, NASA Fire and Rescue Office, 867-3795. (AJ)




