### NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS:

To increase fiber in your diet:

- Eat at least five servings of fruit and vegetables a day. Eat fruits with edible skins, such as an apple. Also eat more green leafy vegetables.
- Switch to whole-grain and whole-wheat breads, pasta, tortillas, and cereals. The first ingredient listed should be whole-wheat flour. If it just says wheat flour, it means white flour, from which most of the fiber has been removed.
- Eat more cooked dried beans, peas and lentils.
- Popcorn is a good high-fiber snack. However, avoid added oil, butter and salt. (TA-C2)


