**NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS:** According to consumer research, taste is one of the reasons why people choose one food over another. For most Americans, enjoyment is as important as nutrition, which is one of the reasons obesity is at an all-time high in the United States. Nutritionists say it's important to find ways for people to enjoy some of their favorite treats while consuming less fat and fewer calories. Consumers wishing to cut fat or sugar in their favorite sweets should experiment with different substitutions. Here are some examples:

- Applesauce for butter or shortening in cakes and cookies;
- 3/4 cup vegetable or canola oil for 1 cup shortening;
- Two egg whites or 1/4 cup egg substitute for 1 whole egg;
- 2 percent or skim milk for whole or evaporated milk;
- Low-fat or no-fat cream cheese for the regular variety. (TA-E2)

**LEAVE ADMINISTRATION:** Properly managing the use of annual and sick leave is your responsibility. Except for emergencies, you are expected to request leave in advance and obtain your supervisor's approval. In cases of emergency absence, call in and notify your supervisor of the circumstances as soon as possible after the start of the workday, but no later than 4 hours after the beginning of the workday. Failure to properly request and obtain approval of leave may result in the absence being charged to "Absence Without Leave" and could also lead to disciplinary action. Those who are earning annual leave above maximum accumulations limits must plan use of annual leave to avoid loss of one or more days at the end of the year. (BA-B).

**OIG:** The Office of the Inspector General is the focal point within NASA for conducting audits and investigations to promote economy and efficiency and to prevent and detect fraud and abuse in NASA programs and operations. The OIG receives and investigates complaints or information about inefficiencies, mismanagement, or gross waste of funds; possible violations of law, rules, or regulations by NASA employees, contractors, or others; or substantial and specific danger to the public health and safety. The Inspector General will not disclose the identity of a person who provides such information without that person's permission, unless the Inspector General determines that disclosure is unavoidable during the course of investigation. NASA employees are protected by law from reprisal for making complaints or disclosing information to the Inspector General. 
