FEDERAL EMPLOYEES HEALTH BENEFITS EXTENSION OF COVERAGE: The Federal Employees Health Benefits Amendments Act (PL 100-654) has provided separated employees, certain dependent children, and former spouses the option of keeping their Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) plan for specific periods of time. Under the provisions, employees who leave the Government, either voluntarily or involuntarily, are eligible to continue FEHB coverage for 18 months if (1) the employee was enrolled in the FEHB at time of separation; and, (2) the employee was NOT fired because of "gross misconduct." This includes employees who retire and are not eligible to continue FEHB coverage as annuitants. Children who become age 22 and ex-spouses may continue coverage for up to 36 months provided they had coverage under a Federal employee at the time of the event. These individuals have continuation of coverage for 31 days at no cost to them. However, within 60 days of the event, they must submit paperwork to continue their FEHB. SECURITY NOTICE: Florida State Statute 316.1975, Unattended Motor Vehicles, states: "no person driving or in charge of any motor vehicle except a licensed delivery truck, or other delivery vehicle while making deliveries, shall permit it to stand unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, and removing the key." Do not leave the engine running in your unattended vehicle, at any time. (TA-E2)

EMPLOYEES PLANNING FOR RETIREMENT: To make tentative annuity computations, verify creditable service, and process an application for retirement, employees considering retirement should assure that all military and civilian service has been properly documented in their personnel records. Although dates of military service may have been previously recorded and verified, these dates should be reverified so there will be no delay in the receipt of annuity checks. Employees who have had active military service should submit to Sharon Lowry, Retirement Counselor, Personnel Office Benefits Team (BA-B), copies of their military discharge papers, DD 214, or other documents showing the beginning and ending dates of active service. Employees who do not ensure that all active duty military service is properly documented may experience a delay in the receipt of full annuity payments from OPM upon retirement from civil service. KSC SMOKING POLICY: Location and Identification of Smoking Areas In accordance with KMI 1216.1 “**KSC Smoking Policy**” Revision E. dated 6/30/00 designated non-smoking areas will be identified by the facility manager and posted as such to ensure personnel and operational safety and fire prevention. 1. To the greatest extent possible, entrance to facilities will be designated and maintained as “**Smoke Free**” zones. 2. Smokers will be afforded easily accessible smoking areas. 3. Signs will be posted in all areas where smoking is not permitted. Approx. 50% of the exit doors at each facility are designated as non-smoking areas and areas near an air intake are also designated as non-smoking. If a sign is posted stating “**This Entrance Is Designated As A Non-Smoking Area Please Do Not Smoke In The Vicinity**” or “**Due To The Proximity Of The Air Intake Ducts, This Area Is Designated Non-Smoking. Please Do Not Smoke In This Vicinity**” do not smoke in that area. If there is not a sign posted that is a smoking area, Facility Managers can obtain the Non-Smoking signs from Sheryl Marshall, TA-F, 867-8047 or email Sheryl.marshall-1@ksc.nasa.gov. A covered area for smokers at the Headquarters building has been proposed and approved for design. Timing of construction of the smoker’s canopy is dependent upon available funding. While every attempt is made to situate smoking areas where there is a covered area, protection from the elements remains a personal responsibility. The use of a sunscreen and a hat are recommended whenever you are outdoors in Florida, during daylight hours. 


