

SUNS is integrated with the Agencywide Full-Text Technical Standards System for updated Standards Product acquisition. NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: While all the research data isn't in yet, early studies indicate that consuming soy products may reduce the risks of some diseases. Soy may halt the chain of events that leads to clogged arteries—some research suggests that soy foods help lower cholesterol and it appears that the higher the initial cholesterol level, the more effective soy is in reducing it. Soy is also a rich source of phytochemicals—plant substances that may have health-promoting properties. Genestein, one of the phytochemicals in soy, may suppress the growth of tumor cells that form cancer. Soy may reduce the risk of prostate cancer in men and the risk of breast cancer in women. During menopause, when a woman's estrogen production is declining, soy can provide some hormones and may reduce hot flashes. Soy's high-quality protein also provides vegetarians with all the amino acids essential for building muscles. (TA-C2)

KSC LOCATOR UPDATES: Mailcodes, locations, and phone numbers have changed significantly due to reorganizations. Please review the monthly NASA/KSC Locator computer printout of personnel assigned to your area and update the information as required. Form 13-58, "Employee Locator Information," has been revised. Please discard revisions prior to January 1996. Form 13-58 is required for all new employees to secure status in the NASA/KSC Locator, the X.500 Personnel Directory, and for home phone number listing. (TA-E1)

BUSINESS REPLY LABELS: KSC Form 7-597, "Business Reply Label," is a restricted-use form available to support official mailing requirements of administrative materials back to KSC by employees while on travel status. Please note this form can only be used for mailing materials back to a KSC mailcode as printed in the appropriate space provided. Prudent use of this mailing label is encouraged to avoid unnecessary postage expenses. (TA-E1)

SICK LEAVE AND FAMILY/FRIENDLY LEAVE—DOCTOR'S CERTIFICATE: Reminder to supervisors and employees: A doctor's certificate (SF-71), or an individual note signed by the physician, is normally required for sick leave absences of more than 3 days. Employees, supervisors, and timekeepers should be aware that time and attendance cards must be initialed in cases where a doctor's certificate is not required. (BA-B)

ATTENTION ALL CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES REPRESENTED BY AFGE LOCAL 2498: Employees represented by AFGE Local 2498 are advised of their right to union representation at any examination of them, in the unit, by a representative of the employer, in connection with an investigation if: (1) The employee reasonably believes that the examination may result in disciplinary action against the employee, and (2) the employee requests representation. This right is conferred by Section 7114 (a) (2) (B) and (3) of Chapter 71, Title 5, U.S.C., and is also contained in Article 4, Section 2, of the Negotiated Agreement. Under Article 5, Section 3, of the Agreement, the Union also has the right to be represented at any formal discussion between representatives of the employer and unit employees, or their representatives, concerning grievances, personnel policies or practices, or conditions of employment. 

KSC SMOKING POLICY: Location and Identification of Smoking Areas in accordance with KMI 1216.1 **"KSC Smoking Policy"** Revision E. dated 6/30/00 designated non-smoking areas will be identified by the facility manager and posted as such to ensure personnel and operational safety and fire prevention. 1. To the greatest extent possible, entrance to facilities will be designated and maintained as **"Smoke Free"** zones. 2. Smokers will be afforded easily accessible smoking areas. 3. Signs will be posted in all areas where smoking is not permitted. Approx. 50% of the exit doors at each facility are designated as non-smoking areas and areas near an air intake are also designated as non-smoking. If a sign is posted stating **"This Entrance Is Designated As A Non-Smoking Area Please Do Not Smoke In The Vicinity"** or **"Due To The Proximity Of The Air Intake Ducts, This Area Is Designated Non-Smoking. Please Do Not Smoke In This Vicinity"** do not smoke in that area. If there is not a sign posted, that is a smoking area Facility Managers can obtain the Non-Smoking signs from Sheryl Marshall, TA-F, 867-8047 or email Sheryl.marshall-1@ksc.nasa.gov. A covered area for smokers at the Headquarters building has been proposed and approved for design. Timing of construction of the smoker's canopy is dependent upon available funding. While every attempt is made to situate smoking areas where there is a covered area, protection from the elements remains a personal responsibility. The use of a sunscreen and a hat are recommended whenever you are outdoors in Florida, during daylight hours. The following have been identified as **Designated Smoking Areas** for the KSC Industrial Area Major Buildings: KSC HQ—East and west of the front entrance—Outside doors 1134, 1167, 1233, 1261, 1349, 1457, 1504, 1527, 1546A, 1627, and 1648—Bike rack shelter area outside of 1466 and 1233 O&C—B-2, B-3, B-5, B-9, B-11, B-13, C-4, C-6, and C-9 SSPF—1000, 1600C, 1100, and 1200 CIF—100 North Door, 131 West Door, 153 South Door, and 166 East Door.
