NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: How many times has your optometrist asked you about your diet? Often, nutrition is an overlooked solution to future eye problems. Your sight can be improved with the right nutrients and the right foods. Some of these sight saving nutrients are:

1. Lutein which is found in green leafy vegetables such as spinach, collards, cabbage, tomatoes, as well as in the yolk of eggs. Lutein protects your vision in two ways: By acting like a soldier, attacking free radicals, protecting your vision from cataracts and by acting like a filter, filtering out dangerous blue tints, preventing macular degeneration.
2. Vitamin C stops cataracts from forming as well as from progressing. The most well known source of vitamin C is the orange. Vitamin C is also found in fruits and vegetables, such as broccoli, grapefruit, tomatoes, cantaloupe, peppers, and cabbage.
3. Vitamin A, also known as retinol, is concentrated in our eyes. It is essential for proper vision. If there is a deficiency, the first sign is poor night vision or trouble adjusting to bright lights. Fortunately, this can easily be corrected. You can obtain vitamin A from many sources such as cheeses, fish oil, milk, liver, and eggs. (TA-C2)

KSC SMOKING POLICY: Location and Identification of Smoking Areas in accordance with KMI 1216.1 "**KSC Smoking Policy**" Revision E, dated 6/30/00 designated non-smoking areas will be identified by the facility manager and posted as such to ensure personnel and operational safety and fire prevention. 1. To the greatest extent possible, entrance to facilities will be designated and maintained as "**Smoke Free**" zones. 2. Smokers will be afforded easily accessible smoking areas. 3. Signs will be posted in all areas where smoking is not permitted. Approx. 50% of the exit doors at each facility are designated as non-smoking areas and areas near an air intake are also designated as non-smoking. If a sign is posted stating "**This Entrance Is Designated As A Non-Smoking Area Please Do Not Smoke In The Vicinity**" or "**Due To The Proximity Of The Air Intake Ducts, This Area Is Designated Non-Smoking. Please Do Not Smoke In This Vicinity**" do not smoke in that area. If there is not a sign posted, that is a smoking area Facility Managers can obtain the Non-Smoking signs from Sheryl Marshall, TA-F, 867-8047 or email Sheryl.marshall-1@ksc.nasa.gov. A covered area for smokers at the Headquarters building has been proposed and approved for design. Timing of construction of the smoker's canopy is dependent upon available funding. While every attempt is made to situate smoking areas where there is a covered area, protection from the elements remains a personal responsibility. The use of a sunscreen and a hat are recommended whenever you are outdoors in Florida, during daylight hours.
