- Remove the bread basket from the table, this only fills you up on low-fiber, low-nutrient food
• Stick to only one alcoholic beverage, try non-alcoholic drinks instead
• Ask for sauces and dressings on the side, this way you will have more control over what your food is laden with
• Ask how the food is prepared, avoid fried foods and sauces/soups made with cream sauces
• Choose two appetizers rather than a large entree, example shrimp cocktail and a salad
• If your entree is large, share it with a friend or take home half for lunch the next day
• If you have dessert, share one with everyone at the table, you can still enjoy yourself without overeating.

TURTLE NESTING SEASON IS HERE! The months of May thru October are the prime months for sea turtles to nest along our beaches. KSC and CCAFS have some of the only remaining pristine beaches along the East Coast of Florida. Sea turtles use these beaches in high numbers for nesting. All exterior lighting at KSC and CCAFS, not just that which directly hits the beaches, can be a distraction to these turtles causing disorientation and nest abandonment. Please, take extra measures to ensure all non-essential exterior lighting is turned off. 
