NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: Snacking isn't exactly bad for you... Almost everyone snacks, but snacking isn't necessarily bad. In fact, frequent mini-meals can be good for you. The real problem with snacking is not when you snack or even if you snack - it's what you choose to eat. Whether you buy snacks ready made or make them at home, the trick is to steer clear of foods with excess fats and sugar and little nutritional value and to surround yourself with plenty of good-tasting foods that are rich in vitamins, minerals and fiber. Binge control - If eating some low-fat whole-grain crackers, a few pretzels, a piece of fruit or some vegetables keeps you from eating a second or third helping at dinner, you may save calories. Good for you snacks start with a proper pantry. Stock your fridge with foods that are fast, not fussy. Variety can also be helpful. Some ideas include:

- Toast a whole wheat English muffin. Top with a slice of tomato and American cheese. Microwave until the cheese melts
• Mash a half banana into peanut butter and spread on a whole-grain bagel
• Mix cold leftover chicken with seedless grapes, sunflower seeds, plain yogurt and a dash of curry powder. Stuff into a hollowed out green pepper or whole wheat pita pocket.
• Spread one half of a small cinnamon raisin bagel with part skim ricotta cheese. Top with apple slices.
• Top a baked potato with plain yogurt and Cajun seasoning.

Snacks rich in complex carbohydrates and fiber will give you immediate energy that has some staying power. A small amount of low-fat protein adds more sustained energy as well. TURTLE NESTING SEASON IS HERE! The months of May thru October are the prime months for sea turtles to nest along our beaches. KSC and CCAFS have some of the only remaining pristine beaches along the East Coast of Florida. Sea turtles use these beaches in high numbers for nesting. All exterior lighting at KSC and CCAFS, not just that which directly hits the beaches, can be a distraction to these turtles causing disorientation and nest abandonment. Please, take extra measures to ensure all non-essential exterior lighting is turned off. INSPECTOR GENERAL: The Office of Criminal Investigations (OCI) is the investigative arm of the NASA Inspector General (IG). The OCI is an independent entity and reports directly to Robert Cobb, the NASA IG, in Washington D.C. The primary mission of this component is to conduct criminal and civil investigations of reported or suspected fraudulent acts by employees, contractors, and others relating to the administration of NASA contracts and programs. Although emphasis is placed on major procurement fraud, (particularly allegations of defective/substandard parts, mischarging, kickbacks, bid rigging, and research fraud), investigations are also conducted of theft, conflict of interest, environmental and hazardous waste violations, health care fraud, and computer related crimes. OCI also provides fraud briefings for Government and contractor employees that are designed to highlight potential risks concerning fraud and related matters.
