Please ensure that you score your CD's before forwarding them to us. After November 15, these recyclable commodities will be shipped to the nearest recycling/reuse facility in our area. This activity will not only promote the objective of ARD, but it will also provide measurements of how many pounds of CD's and transparencies are diverted from the landfill. NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: Having more salads is a wonderful way to get a wide variety of nutrients and health-promoting phytochemicals that lower our risk of cancer and other diseases. But if your salads are full of high fat, high-calorie ingredients, they may be less helpful in losing weight than you think. For example, each tablespoon of regular salad dressing contains 70 to 80 calories. The dressing ladles at many salad bars hold four times that amount; so one or more ladles of dressing can easily boost the calorie and fat count. If you choose oily marinated salads or mayonnaise-based foods like tuna salad or potato salad, you'll also increase the calorie content. On the other hand, perhaps your salad lunch is too lean. A poorly balanced meal that neglects protein and grain products and severely limits calories often leads to major mid-afternoon hunger. A trip to the vending machine can add enough calories to more than make up for those saved at lunch. Perhaps the key to your weight-loss goal lies in improving snack habits or boosting physical activity. TURTLE NESTING SEASON IS HERE! The months of May thru October are the prime months for sea turtles to nest along our beaches. KSC and CCAFS have some of the only remaining pristine beaches along the East Coast of Florida. Sea turtles use these beaches in high numbers for nesting. All exterior lighting at KSC and CCAFS, not just that which directly hits the beaches, can be a distraction to these turtles causing disorientation and nest abandonment. Please, take extra measures to ensure all non-essential exterior lighting is turned off. TOUR—ATLAS V VIF AIR CONDITIONING SHELTER: The VIF Air Conditioning Shelter (ACS) contains the Central Chiller Plant for all air conditioning demand for the VIF facility and the Lockheed Martin Atlas V launch vehicle Environmental Control Systems (ECS). The chiller coolant is a 20% / 80% propylene glycol/water mixture that provides 34°F chilled water in order to meet the ECS low air moisture content requirements, while utilizing heat exchangers to provide 42°F chilled water to the facility air handlers located in the VIF. The ECS primary air processing equipment (pre-filtration systems, de-humidifiers, blowers, cold coils, boilers, heaters, humidifiers, instrumentation) is located in the ACS and the vehicle air is ducted to the VIF and through the Mobile Launch Platform (MLP) to the vehicle. Additional instrumentation, valves and final filtration systems process the ECS air at the VIF and on the MLP. Outside air is ducted from the ACS to the VIF, providing facility ventilation and positive pressure capability of facility rooms. An outside air fan house delivers air to the Payload ECS air handlers and dehumidifier reactivation air. Three dual cell, closed loop evaporative cooling towers provide heat rejection for the chillers and are located outside and east of the ACS. A double ended 2500 kVA substation located in the ACS and fed from two separate sources provides power for the entire VIF complex. All ECS/HVAC is controlled and monitored through Triconex Programmable Logic Controllers (PLC) that use triplicated instrumentation for all critical vehicle measurements. Redundancy was considered for all critical processes in the design of the ECS systems. The tours are scheduled for 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on October 29 and 31 lasting no more than an hour.
