JSC FORMS—SHANA INFORMED FILLER: The deployment of Shana Informed Filler is a NASA initiative to replace the current JetForm/FormFlow Filler application for use with KSC Forms. Most electronic forms have been converted. The remaining forms will be available as JetForm forms until the conversions are complete.

- ODIN PC desktops users require no action on their part. The electronic forms software has been installed automatically. Visit the KSC Forms web site and *open* any Shana Informed e-Form. The form will open in Informed Filler.
- ODIN Macintosh users requiring the electronic forms software must call the ODIN Help Desk and schedule a technician to manually install the software on their machine.
- J-BOSC supported PC desktops can install the software from the JBOSC Menu, Presentation, Install Shana Informed [OR from your Y: drive select Shortcuts, Presentation, Install Shana Informed]
 - Run the Shortcut selecting Next on all of the default selections (Welcome Next, Typical Next, Informed Next, Finish). This same Shortcut can be used to Uninstall Shana Informed software.
 - J-BOSC Macintosh users needing the electronic forms software must also call the Care Center and schedule a technician to install the software on their machine.
- USA and Boeing supported desktops will be supplied with the Informed Filler software by their respective organizations. Contact your Help Desk.
- Currently the 45th Space Wing (AF) will continue to use JetForm as their official electronic forms software package, so if you require access to the AF forms you will need both form filler packages.

Users may access the forms in either of two ways:

(1) Visit the KSC Forms web site and *open* any Shana Informed e-Form. The form will open in Informed Filler. **<http://kscforms.ksc.nasa.gov/index.html>**

(2) On your local machine: Click on Start -> Programs -> Informed -> Informed Filler. For a New Data Document (a form you have not previously saved data into) select Services and KEF_DC. Documentation on the product is available on the web page or through the Informed "Help" tab.

NASA is proposing entering into an agreement with the State of Florida, through the Florida Space Authority, to develop an International Space Research Park (ISRP) on the Kennedy Space Center. The goal of the Park is to provide an opportunity for appropriate commercial, research and educational interests to develop new, state-of-the-art facilities to promote the expanded use of space. An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) addressing the impacts of the proposed development on two alternative sites on the Kennedy Space Center is being prepared and will be discussed. 

ATTENTION ALL CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES REPRESENTED BY AFGE LOCAL 2498: Employees represented by AFGE Local 2498 are advised of their right to union representation at any examination of them, in the unit, by a representative of the employer, in connection with an investigation if: (1) The employee reasonably believes that the examination may result in disciplinary action against the employee, and (2) the employee requests representation. This right is conferred by Section 7114 (a) (2) (B) and (3) of Chapter 71, Title 5, U.S.C., and is also contained in Article 4, Section 2, of the Negotiated Agreement. Under Article 5, Section 3, of the Agreement, the Union also has the right to be represented at any formal discussion between representatives of the employer and unit employees, or their representatives, concerning grievances, personnel policies or practices, or conditions of employment. (BA-B)

OIG: The Office of the Inspector General is the focal point within NASA for conducting audits and investigations to promote economy and efficiency and to prevent and detect fraud and abuse in NASA programs and operations. The OIG receives and investigates complaints or information about inefficiencies, mismanagement, or gross waste of funds; possible violations of law, rules, or regulations by NASA employees, contractors, or others; or substantial and specific danger to the public health and safety. The Inspector General will not disclose the identity of a person who provides such information without that person's permission, unless the Inspector General determines that disclosure is unavoidable during the course of investigation. NASA employees are protected by law from reprisal for making complaints or disclosing information to the Inspector General. INSPECTOR GENERAL: The Office of Criminal Investigations (OCI) is the investigative arm of the NASA Inspector General (IG). The OCI is an independent entity and reports directly to Robert Cobb, the NASA IG, in Washington D.C. The primary mission of this component is to conduct criminal and civil investigations of reported or suspected fraudulent acts by employees, contractors, and others relating to the administration of NASA contracts and programs. Although emphasis is placed on major procurement fraud, (particularly allegations of defective/substandard parts, mischarging, kickbacks, bid rigging, and research fraud), investigations are also conducted of theft, conflict of interest, environmental and hazardous waste violations, health care fraud, and computer related crimes. OCI also provides fraud briefings for Government and contractor employees that are designed to highlight potential risks concerning fraud and related matters.
