**CONFIDENTIAL FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE REPORT (OGE FORM) FILING:** Those individuals reporting to a position for which there is a requirement for an initial and annual 450 filing are reminded the INITIAL filing must be completed no later than 30 days after reporting to that position. Forms are available from the Office of Chief Counsel by calling 867-2552. (CC)

**MISUSE OF THE NASA INSIGNIA:** Use of the computer templates, containing the NASA Insignia, for the production of NASA letterhead in electronic form is not authorized and should be removed from all computer systems. The Associate Administrator for Public Affairs has requested all NASA centers use only the printed NASA letterhead stationery. "The use of computer file NASA Insignias to custom design stationery provides opportunities for image manipulation and standards degradation which will adversely reflect the professional image of the Agency." If not approved for specific applications, electronic images of the NASA Insignia ("meatball") should be removed from computer systems. (TA-E1)

EEO Counselors are trained to inform you of your rights, answer your questions, and can do limited fact finding into your allegations. **MISUSE OF OFFICE COPIER PAPER:** Paper delivered to the Lanier copiers must not be used for any purpose other than making copies on Lanier copiers. The costs of the machine, maintenance, and all other supplies (staplers, toner, etc.) are included in the cost of office copy paper; this paper is more expensive than paper issued for typing, fax machines, or laser printers. Paper for typing, faxing, and laser printers should be requisitioned from your Logistics Service Center (NASA/SGS only), under Stock No. 7530-01-335-2623. **MAIL SERVICES:** Requests for mail services should be submitted through your organizational admin office or contractor mail coordinator. NASA Form 28-170, "Request for Mail Services," should be utilized for additions, deletions, or changes to existing mailcodes. Adjustments to the total number of employees serviced and standard distributions required will contribute to paper conservation. (TA-E1)

**KSC LOCATOR UPDATES:** Mailcodes, locations, and phone numbers have changed significantly due to reorganizations. Please review the monthly NASA/KSC Locator computer printout of personnel assigned to your area and update the information as required. Form 13-58, "Employee Locator Information," has been revised. Please discard revisions prior to July, 2001. Form 13-58 is required for all new employees to secure status in the NASA/KSC Locator, the X.500 Personnel Directory, and for home phone number listing. **BUSINESS REPLY LABELS:** KSC Form 7-597, "Business Reply Label," is a restricted-use form available to support official mailing requirements of administrative materials back to KSC by employees while on travel status. Please note this form can only be used for mailing materials back to a KSC mailcode as printed in the appropriate space provided. Prudent use of this mailing label is encouraged to avoid unnecessary postage expenses. (TA-E1)

**TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER PROGRAM:** The main purpose of NASA's Technology Transfer Program is to transfer new technology to commercial organizations for ultimate benefit to the general public. The new technology items so transferred are often referred to as "Space Spinoffs." KSC and contractor employees are urged to participate in this important program by reporting their items of new technology. Such items may include any new or improved technique, tool, computer program, management systems or scientific data. KSC or contractor employees whose items qualify for publication in NASA Tech Briefs will receive a \$350 award. New Technology items should be reported on NASA Form 1679 to the KSC Technology Transfer Officer, Dave Makufka, YA-C1.
