NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: How Low Can Your Calories Go? We've been taught for decades that too many calories make us overweight. And it's true. Taking in fewer calories by eating less or using more calories by exercising more will most definitely result in weight loss. But making a too-drastring cut in your caloric intake is not a good idea. It's only human to think the more calories you cut, the better. But, in actuality, when taken to the extreme, the opposite is true. Weight loss experts say that cutting your calories down to, or under, 1,000 per day sets you up for inevitable failure. Why? Because when you whittle your caloric intake down this low, you are actually sending your body into "starvation mode" by eating far too little. You're sending a signal to your system that there's a famine... albeit a self-induced one. Your body wants to maintain your weight when it "thinks" you are starving; therefore, your metabolism will actually slow down. This will inevitably cause you to not lose weight, defeating the purpose of why you cut your calories in the first place! Another reason extremely low-cal diets won't work is because it's nearly impossible to stay on one for very long. In addition to not losing any weight, there are definitely some other unfavorable side effects. Other telltale signs that you've gone too low on caloric intake include headache, weakness, light-headedness and reduced concentration levels. Eventually you will experience intense hunger and your body will cue you to make up for all those missing calories. After depriving yourself for so long you will be far more likely to overeat and in the end, you will most likely gain rather than lose weight. Mr. Sam Lewellen, KSC Center Export Administrator (CEA), has determined that **KSC-STD-E-0012E, "Facility Grounding and Lightning Protection, Standard for," is eligible for public access.** 14 other KSC specifications and standards, (see list below) are still considered export-controlled technical data under ITAR or EAR regulations (see definitions below.) **They should not be released for public access.**


**EXCESS GOVERNMENT PROPERTY:** All excess government property must be turned in to the NASA Property Disposal Officer at the Reutilization, Recycling and Marketing facility on Ransom Road. No other location is authorized to retain the government's idle property. This includes expendable items, as well as tagged equipment. For additional information on turn-in of excess property, see KHB 4000.1C, Part 8, Section 5, "Turn-In of Materials and Equipment." (TA-E1)

**MESSENGER ENVELOPES (STANDARD FORMS 65 B & C) USERS:** All offices are reminded that excess messenger envelopes should be returned to the Forms Warehouse, through the mail and distribution system, for reissue. The appropriate mailcode to use is "Forms Warehouse." (TA-E1)

**NASA/JBOSC OUTBOUND SHIPMENTS:** To help ensure that all users of the JBOSC Shipping Department have their requirements met, the following procedure must be adhered to: Shipments processed through the JBOSC Shipping Department are for official government business only. Personal shipments are not authorized. All shipments must be accompanied by a properly completed shipping request document (KSC Form 7-248 or DD-1149). Carrier freight bills without the proper KSC forms will not be accepted. Shipments involving hazardous materials must have a Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) or other technical data sheet. Small priority/overnight shipments, including letters, must be received in the JBOSC Shipping Department no later than 2 p.m. or they will be processed on the following workday. Large priority shipments and/or shipments requiring extensive packaging must be received at least 48 hours prior to the required date at destination. Government property tagged items need to be routed through the proper Property Control Office before requesting the shipment and/or, if required, accompanied by a copy of a property custodian's approved KSC Form 1602. **PEDESTRIAN SAFETY:** Pedestrians crossing roadways on Kennedy Space Center are reminded to yield the right-of-way to all vehicles when crossing the roadway at a point not within a marked crosswalk. Motorists are reminded to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians crossing the roadway in a marked crosswalk when the pedestrian is on the half of the roadway the vehicle is traveling, or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely as to be in danger.
