YEAR-END PROCESSING OF PURCHASE REQUISITIONS (PRs): All PR's citing appropriated funds that expire on September 30, 2003, must be processed through the NASA electronic Core Financial Accounting System (SAP/R3) in sufficient time to issue purchase orders, contracts, agreements, and modifications to increase the likelihood of obligation prior to fiscal year-end. The Financial Office/GG will ensure PR's containing expiring funds are clearly annotated. Cutoff dates are June 30, 2003 for PR's over \$25,000 and July 31, 2003 for PR's equal to or less than \$25,000. Any PR's citing expiring funds that are generated after the applicable cut-off date must be cleared off-line with an approving Contracting Officer prior to entry in SAP. See the job aid at: http://www-op.ksc.nasa.gov/ifmp/JA.htm for the appropriate approving Contracting Officer for your Directorate. Enter the Contracting Officer's name in the PR Header Text and his associated Purchasing Group in the proper field when creating the PR in SAP. Requisitioners are advised that PR's with non-expiring funds received after the above cut-off dates may be held until after September 30, 2003, to permit priority treatment of those PR's containing expiring funding. **INSPECTOR GENERAL:** The Office of Criminal Investigations (OCI) is the investigative arm of the NASA Inspector General (IG). The OCI is an independent entity and reports directly to Robert Cobb, the NASA IG, in Washington D.C. The primary mission of this component is to conduct criminal and civil investigations of reported or suspected fraudulent acts by employees, contractors, and others relating to the administration of NASA contracts and programs. Although emphasis is placed on major procurement fraud, (particularly allegations of defective/substandard parts, mischarging, kickbacks, bid rigging, and research fraud), investigations are also conducted of theft, conflict of interest, environmental and hazardous waste violations, health care fraud, and computer related crimes. OCI also provides fraud briefings for Government and contractor employees that are designed to highlight potential risks concerning fraud and related matters. Suspected violations can be reported by calling 867-4714 locally, the toll free Hotline at 1-800-424-9183, or by writing NASA Inspector General, P. O. **USE OF FEDERAL PROPERTY:** There are statutory and regulatory prohibitions against the use of Federal property, facilities, and equipment for personal purposes. These prohibitions apply to such items as Government vehicles, office supplies, FTS (Federal Telecommunications Systems), Datafax, computers and network capabilities, reproduction equipment, tools, and a variety of utility and other items. This also applies to equipment provided by the Government for contractor use and to items issued to the Government. Employees have a positive duty to protect and conserve such items and other property entrusted to them. (BA-B)

**KSC LOCATOR:** Personnel at KSC are reminded, when submitting KSC Form 13-58 (Employee Locator Information) to KSC-Locator, to verify all information including the telephone directory information block. Monthly updates to the Locator printouts should be complete. This includes the "Telephone Directory" column. The letter "T" in this column indicates that the name appears in the telephone directory. **OFFICE COPIER VIEWGRAPH MATERIAL:** Viewgraph material will not be supplied to NASA and authorized associated contractors by the copier contractor, Lanier. All viewgraph material must be obtained through JBOSC Supply. The stock numbers are 7530-00-238-9232 and 7530-00-K05-4069. All other viewgraph materials are not acceptable for use in the Lanier Copiers. (TA-B3)

**USE OF MULTICOLOR OFFSET PRINTING, COLOR COPIERS, AND COLOR PRINTERS:** Managers and employees are reminded that all color printing/copying must be in accordance with NPG 1490.5A. The NPG states that offset printing in two or more colors is prohibited for work in which additional colors provide no demonstrable value, but are used primarily for decorative effect. The unnecessary use of color products costs the government additional money without additional benefit. The NASA Inspector General has reviewed various agency products and determined that color products have increased significantly. Managers at all centers are to ensure requests for multicolor printing and color copying are only made when the use of multiple colors adds demonstrable value, not just cosmetic appeal, to the product. **UNAUTHORIZED COMMITMENTS AND RATIFICATIONS:** An unauthorized commitment is an agreement between the Government and a contractor that is not binding; solely, because the Government representative who made it lacked the authority to enter into that **UNAUTHORIZED** agreement on behalf of the Government. Ratification is the act of approving an unauthorized commitment by an official who has the authority to do so. Unauthorized commitments are strongly discouraged and can indicate serious employee misconduct. Individuals making unauthorized commitments may be subject to disciplinary action, and the issue may be referred to the Office of the Inspector General. Only Contracting Officers acting within the limits of their delegated authority are authorized to commit the Government. If you are unsure of your authority, before directing a contractor to take any action, call your project control office, or the Procurement Office at 867-7217, for assistance. (OP-AM)

**PRINTING/COPYING PAPER USERS:** The NASA HQ Code JT has set a goal for each center to reduce the annual use of paper stocks by 10 percent. Suggestions on how to accomplish this goal are printing on both sides of the paper; circulating, posting, and publishing memoranda and other information using email, bulletin boards, routing slips, newsletters; and distributing documents in electronic format via file servers or home pages to avoid making copies on office copiers. Your support in implementing these suggestions will help meet KSC's paper reduction goal. (TA-B3)

**ORDERING BLANK FORMS/PUBLICATIONS:** All requests for blank forms and publications should be submitted on KSC Form 7-11 to the Forms Warehouse (mailcode: "FORMS WAREHOUSE"). Allow approximately 5 working days to receive the requested material. Any requests for emergency or work-stoppage forms will be handled by Forms Control by calling 867-3590. Customers should not go directly to the warehouse to pick up forms without calling Forms Control first. 
