NUTRITION TIP FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTER: Junk food has given snacking a bad name. Eat when you're hungry, stop when you're comfortable. There's a difference between stuffed and comfortable. Here's a list of favorite healthy snacks.

- **Popcorn.** The fat in those microwave brands is the only negative here. Look for the healthier versions—98% fat-free.
 - **Fruit and fruit smoothies.** For a complete, sustainable snack, make a fruit smoothie—the dairy will sustain you.
 - **Cheese and crackers.** Only if you pick a reduced-fat cheese that tastes good, like Kraft 2% and Jarlsberg Light. Lower fat means more protein. Crackers should be whole grain, low-fat, for this to be a healthy snack. The more fat in the cracker, the more trans-fat it will contain.
 - **Cereals.** Choose high-fiber, low-sugar cereals like oatmeal.
 - **Yogurt/frozen yogurt.** Yogurt doesn't need sugar to taste good. Buy plain yogurt and add something to it, like low-fat granola and fruit, for a truly healthy snack.
 - **Popsicles/frozen fruit bars.** There are some excellent, 100% fruit-juice choices out there.
 - **Vegetables.** Awesome, awesome, awesome snack. The more colorful the platter, the better.
 - **Peanut butter.** It's OK, but only if you just eat a tablespoon, and just with wholegrain crackers or toast.
 - **Granola bars.** The chewier they are, the more sugar and fat they have. The healthy ones are crunchy, and not coated in chocolate.

INSPECTOR GENERAL: The Office of Criminal Investigations (OCI) is the investigative arm of the NASA Inspector General (IG). The OCI is an independent entity and reports directly to Robert Cobb, the NASA IG, in Washington D.C. The primary mission of this component is to conduct criminal and civil investigations of reported or suspected fraudulent acts by employees, contractors, and others relating to the administration of NASA contracts and programs. Although emphasis is placed on major procurement fraud, (particularly allegations of defective/substandard parts, mischarging, kickbacks, bid rigging, and research fraud), investigations are also conducted of theft, conflict of interest, environmental and hazardous waste violations, health care fraud, and computer related crimes. OCI also provides fraud briefings for Government and contractor employees that are designed to highlight potential risks concerning fraud and related matters. Suspected violations can be reported by calling 867-4714 locally, the toll free Hotline at 1-800-424-9183, or by writing NASA Inspector General, P. O. MAIL SERVICES: Requests for mail services should be submitted through your organizational admin office or contractor mail coordinator. NASA Form 28-170, "Request for Mail Services," should be utilized for additions, deletions, or changes to existing mailcodes. KSC LOCATOR UPDATES: Mailcodes, locations, and phone numbers have changed significantly due to reorganizations. Please review the monthly NASA/KSC Locator computer printout of personnel assigned to your area and update the information as required. Form 13-58, "Employee Locator Information," has been revised. Please discard revisions prior to July, 2001. Form 13-58 is required for all new employees to secure status in the NASA/KSC Locator and the X.500 Personnel Directory. (TA-E1)

BUSINESS REPLY LABELS: KSC Form 7-597, "Business Reply Label," is a restricted-use form available to support official mailing requirements of administrative materials back to KSC by employees while on travel status. Please note this form can only be used for mailing materials back to a KSC mailcode as printed in the appropriate space provided. Prudent use of this mailing label is encouraged to avoid unnecessary postage expenses. (TA-E1)

KSC or contractor employees whose items qualify for publication in NASA Tech Briefs will receive a \$350 award.
