TOUR THE WATERS SURROUNDING KSC DURING EEAW - 4/21 & 4/22: Tour and observe the aquatic resources of the waters surrounding KSC during Environmental & Energy Awareness Week, 4/21 & 4/22. There will be several 1-hour boat trips per day in the Banana River (10am-11am and 1pm-2pm). They will start and stop from the boat dock on the Northeast side of the Banana River Bridge on the NASA Causeway. These trips will travel north to the pepper flats area and back. Participants will learn about the different monitoring and research projects that are conducted in the waters surrounding KSC. This will include pointing out the different types of Seagrass, discussion of water quality research, manatee and dolphin research, and impoundment research. Participants will also be able to observe the diverse and abundant wildlife found in the Banana River and surrounding habitats. Permission from supervisor is needed, space is limited. KSC EXOTICS BOAT TOUR DURING EEAW - 4/21 & 4/22: Brazilian pepper-tree (*Schinus terebinthifolius*) is one of the most aggressive of the invasive non-native plants in Florida. On KSC, the Brazilian pepper-tree is invading aquatic and terrestrial habitats, greatly reducing the quality of native biotic communities. Join a one hour Brazilian pepper boat tour during Environmental & Energy Awareness Week, 4/21 & 4/22, to the saltmarsh impoundments in the Banana River. There will be several 1-hour boat trips per day in the Banana River (11-12 and 2-3). They will start and stop from the boat dock on the Northeast side of the Banana River Bridge on the NASA Causeway. See how this impact has allowed exotic plants like Brazilian pepper to colonize and overtake the impoundment. How does this impact the environment? What are we doing now to restore these natural areas back to their original conditions? Participants will learn the identification of the plants, health concerns, and control/eradication techniques. SOLAR ARRAY TUBES PROTECT SPACEFLIGHT FILM: Join this tour on 4/21 at 11 A.M. - The Film Storage Building, M6-639, has a special dehumidification system to maintain the stringent requirements of preserving historical original space flight film. The solar array dehumidification system removes moisture from the storage space and then electrically-heats the air. The system uses the sun's energy instead of electricity to recharge the dehumidification system. You will visit the latest evacuated-tube solar array up close! You will get a chance to examine all the pumps, gages, and other working components of the solar system. Total tour time is 45 minutes. WHERE DOES KSC'S WATER GO?: When you flush the toilet at KSC or CCAFS, where does the water go? It goes to the CCAFS Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility located at the north end of Scrub Jay Road. Approximately 600,000 gallons of wastewater per day, collected from KSC and CCAFS, are treated beyond regulatory requirements and then discharged to the surficial aquifer via percolation ponds. Come take a one hour guided tour (1-2 p.m.) of this exceptional facility during Environmental and Energy Awareness Week on April 21st and 22nd. Departure will be from the EEAW Welcome Table. PHOTOVOLTAIC SOLAR PANEL ARRAY TOUR ON APRIL 21ST AND 22ND FROM 12-1: The SGS Energy Management is offering a tour of the Photovoltaic System at Field Mill Site 18 on April 21st and 22nd, from 12-1 p.m. during the Environmental and Energy Awareness Week. Total tour time is 1 hour. The Photovoltaic Array provides 1 KW (energy used to power approximately 10 computer monitors) of clean power to one of NASA's rural weather monitoring field sites. The monitoring sites are an important part of the Spaceports Launch Pad Lightning Warning System (LPLWS). The PV array replaces a diesel generator with solar energy. It is in a remote location, so long pants and closed-toed shoes are recommended. Vans will pick up participants from the Environmental and Energy Awareness Welcome tent. MANATEE TOUR IN CELEBRATION OF EEAW - APRIL 22 (THURSDAY ONLY): The protected waters of KSC provide ideal habitat for one of Florida's most endearing creatures, the Manatee. Each spring, manatees leave their winter range in south Florida and migrate to the Banana River and Indian River Lagoon in large numbers. During the spring of 2003, around 400 manatees showed up in the waters of KSC and the Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge and this represented about a quarter of the east coast population. This is the largest warm weather concentration of manatees we know of anywhere in their range. During the one-hour tour we will travel to Haulover Canal from the VAB Area/Parking Lot E to view these interesting aquatic mammals and learn about their life history. This colorful and gregarious bird is losing ground as Florida's scrub lands are developed. During the one-hour field trip held on April 21, in celebration of Earth Day, one of our Refuge personnel, Mr. Dorn Whitmore, will show you Scrub Jays up close and discuss how KSC lands are managed for this threatened species. Wear comfortable walking shoes (no sandals please) and it is advisable to bring sunscreen, bug spray, and a hat. Meet at the EEAW Welcome Table in front of the O&C Building at 12 noon. CAN ECOSYSTEMS ON KSC EFFECT GLOBAL CLIMATE CHANGE? Rising atmospheric CO₂ has the potential to stimulate carbon accumulation in ecosystems through direct effects on photosynthesis and growth of plants. There is reason to believe that this would mitigate a significant amount of the CO₂ added each year to the atmosphere through the burning of fossil fuels and tropical deforestation. But would the stimulation of vegetation growth by rising atmospheric CO₂ be limited by availability of water and nutrients? The answer to this fundamental question is critical for evaluating the impacts of global climate change on the natural ecosystems that provide the food, fuel and fiber for all of human activities. Since May of 1996, we have operated 16 open top chambers in a scrub-oak ecosystem on KSC. Can natural ecosystems utilize atmospheric carbon added to the atmosphere by human activities? Meet at the EEAW Welcome Table in front of the O&C Building at 11p.m. on April 21st to witness this experiment, and possibly see some Florida Scrub Jays.
