If you have more books than your outgoing mailbox can hold, please place them in a neat stack on the floor, table or desk next to the mailbox. Please do not put the telephone books in the trash. ### **Can the KSC telephone books be recycled?**

Sure, start by removing all colored pages and the front and back covers of the book. Place all white pages in the sensitive materials recycling container located throughout your facilities and place the colored pages in your mixed office paper recycling containers.

Recycling telephone books into new ones help save precious resources. Products made with old phone books include:

- cellulous insulation (the blown-in kind)
- backing and facing paper for gypsum wallboard
- paper egg cartons
- paper packing material
- envelopes
- newsprint
- paper towels & tissue products
- hydro-seeding mulch (the green stuff you see sprayed on the sides of overpasses)
- chicken litter & animal bedding
- weed barrier for landscapers
- asphalt shingles
- roofing felt
- paper for new phone books

**EMPLOYEES PLANNING FOR RETIREMENT:** To make tentative annuity computations, verify creditable service, and process an application for retirement, employees considering retirement should assure that all military and civilian service has been properly documented in their personnel records. Although dates of military service may have been previously recorded and verified, these dates should be reverified so there will be no delay in the receipt of annuity checks. Employees who have had active military service should submit to Kathleen Ellis or Lisa Fowler, Retirement Counselors, Personnel Office Benefits Team (BA-B), copies of their military discharge papers, DD 214, or other documents showing the beginning and ending dates of active service. Employees who do not ensure that all active duty military service is properly documented may experience a delay in the receipt of full annuity payments from OPM upon retirement from civil service. **FEDERAL EMPLOYEE WORK-RELATED INJURY:** Federal employees are reminded that they are responsible for notifying their supervisors and seeking first-aid care from the KSC Occupational Health Facility for any injury which occurs on the job. **FEDERAL EMPLOYEE HEALTH BENEFITS FOR MILITARY RETIREES:** CHAMPUS coverage for military retirees is automatically transferred from CHAMPUS to Medicare coverage upon attaining the Medicare eligibility, at age 65. Employees have 31 days from the date of loss of CHAMPUS to enroll in a Federal Employees Health Benefit (FEHB) plan. Military retirees who are thinking about retiring from civilian service before reaching Medicare eligibility are reminded: to have FEHB coverage as retiree, an employee must be enrolled at the time of retirement; to insure coverage, they should enroll in an FEHB plan that takes effect before the retirement date elected. To keep FEHB after retirement, employees must be enrolled for at least 5 years; and coverage under CHAMPUS counts towards eligibility to carry FEHB into retirement. **CONFIDENTIAL FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE REPORT (OGE FORM) FILING:** Those individuals reporting to a position for which there is a requirement for an initial and annual 450 filing are reminded the INITIAL filing must be completed no later than 30 days after reporting to that position. Forms are available from the Office of Chief Counsel by calling 867-2552. (CC)

**MISUSE OF THE NASA INSIGNIA:** Use of the computer templates, containing the NASA Insignia, for the production of NASA letterhead in electronic form is not authorized and should be removed from all computer systems. The Associate Administrator for Public Affairs has requested all NASA centers use only the printed NASA letterhead stationery. "The use of computer file NASA Insignias to custom design stationery provides opportunities for image manipulation and standards degradation which will adversely reflect the professional image of the Agency." If not approved for specific applications, electronic images of the NASA Insignia ("meatball") should be removed from computer systems. (IT-D1)

**INSPECTOR GENERAL:** The Office of Criminal Investigations (OCI) is the investigative arm of the NASA Inspector General (IG). The OCI is an independent entity and reports directly to Robert Cobb, the NASA IG, in Washington D.C. The primary mission of this component is to conduct criminal and civil investigations of reported or suspected fraudulent acts by employees, contractors, and others relating to the administration of NASA contracts and programs. Although emphasis is placed on major procurement fraud, (particularly allegations of defective/substandard parts, mischarging, kickbacks, bid rigging, and research fraud), investigations are also conducted of theft, conflict of interest, environmental and hazardous waste violations, health care fraud, and computer related crimes. OCI also provides fraud briefings for Government and contractor employees that are designed to highlight potential risks concerning fraud and related matters.
