**FEDERAL EMPLOYEE HEALTH BENEFITS FOR MILITARY RETIREES:** CHAMPUS coverage for military retirees is automatically transferred from CHAMPUS to Medicare coverage upon attaining the Medicare eligibility, at age 65. Employees have 31 days from the date of loss of CHAMPUS to enroll in a Federal Employees Health Benefit (FEHB) plan. Military retirees who are thinking about retiring from civilian service before reaching Medicare eligibility are reminded: to have FEHB coverage as retiree, an employee must be enrolled at the time of retirement; to insure coverage, they should enroll in an FEHB plan that takes effect before the retirement date elected. To keep FEHB after retirement, employees must be enrolled for at least 5 years; and coverage under CHAMPUS counts towards eligibility to carry FEHB into retirement. **EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATIONS:** Employees have the right to join, or refrain from joining, employee unions. NASA recognizes the right of its employees to form, join, and assist any employee organization, or to refrain from any such activity, and to exercise these rights freely and without penalty or reprisal. This right also extends to participation in the management of the employee organization and to acting as an employee organizational representative, except where such activity would result in a conflict of interest with the official duties of an employee. **FEDERAL EMPLOYEES HEALTH BENEFITS EXTENSION OF COVERAGE:** The Federal Employees Health Benefits Amendments Act (PL 100-654) has provided separated employees, certain dependent children, and former spouses the option of keeping their Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) plan for specific periods of time. Under the provisions, employees who leave the Government, either voluntarily or involuntarily, are eligible to continue FEHB coverage for 18 months if (1) the employee was enrolled in the FEHB at time of separation; and, (2) the employee was NOT fired because of "gross misconduct." This includes employees who retire and are not eligible to continue FEHB coverage as annuitants. Children who become age 22 and ex-spouses may continue coverage for up to 36 months provided they had coverage under a Federal employee at the time of the event. These individuals have continuation of coverage for 31 days at no cost to them. However, within 60 days of the event, they must submit paperwork to continue their FEHB. **LEAVE ADMINISTRATION:** Properly managing the use of annual and sick leave is your responsibility. Except for emergencies, you are expected to request leave in advance and obtain your supervisor's approval. In cases of emergency absence, call in and notify your supervisor of the circumstances as soon as possible after the start of the workday, but no later than 4 hours after the beginning of the workday. Failure to properly request and obtain approval of leave may result in the absence being charged to "Absence Without Leave" and could also lead to disciplinary action. Those who are earning annual leave above maximum accumulations limits must plan use of annual leave to avoid loss of one or more days at the end of the year. (BA-B)

**MAILING PRIVATE INFORMATION:** When mailing documents containing Social Security Numbers or other private information, through the KSC Interoffice Mail system, KSC Form 13-242, A, B, or C, "**Open by Addressee Only**" envelopes must be used. (TA-E1)

**YEAR-END PROCESSING OF PURCHASE REQUISITIONS (PRS) CONTAINING EXPIRING FUNDS** All PRs citing appropriated funds that expire on September 30, 2004, must be processed through NASA's financial system (SAP/R3) in sufficient time to route to the Procurement Office on or before the below dates. This will increase the likelihood of obligation prior to expiration of funds on September 30, 2004. As a result, KSC's CFO and Procurement Officer have jointly established the following cut-off dates for receipt of PRs containing expiring funds: June 30, 2004 for PRs with a total estimate over \$25,000 July 31, 2004 for PRs with a total estimate equal to or less than \$25,000 Make sure the PR Header Text is annotated to reflect "Expiring Funds." If funding status is unknown, the final GG approver will review to determine if funds are expiring and will annotate the PR prior to routing to Procurement. GG will also notify OP periodically of all open, unobligated PR line items that contain expiring funds. Any PRs citing expiring funds that are generated after the applicable cut-off date must be cleared off-line with an approving Contracting Officer prior to entry in SAP. See the job aid at <http://www-op.ksc.nasa.gov/ifmp/JA.htm> for the appropriate approving Contracting Officer for your directorate. Enter the Contracting Officer's name in the PR Header Text and his associated purchasing group (PGrp) in the proper field when creating the PR in SAP. Requisitioners are advised that PRs with non-expiring funds received after the above cut-off dates may be held until after September 30, 2004, to permit priority treatment of those PRs containing expiring funding.
