KSC LIBRARY ARCHIVES: KMI 2240.1 establishes the KSC Library Archives. MAILING PRIVATE INFORMATION: When mailing documents containing Social Security Numbers or other private information, through the KSC Interoffice Mail system, KSC Form 13-242, A, B, or C, **“Open by Addressee Only”** envelopes must be used. (TA-E1)

LEAVE ADMINISTRATION: Properly managing the use of annual and sick leave is your responsibility. Except for emergencies, you are expected to request leave in advance and obtain your supervisor’s approval. In cases of emergency absence, call in and notify your supervisor of the circumstances as soon as possible after the start of the workday, but no later than 4 hours after the beginning of the workday. Failure to properly request and obtain approval of leave may result in the absence being charged to “Absence Without Leave” and could also lead to disciplinary action. Those who are earning annual leave above maximum accumulations limits must plan use of annual leave to avoid loss of one or more days at the end of the year. (BA-B).

EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATIONS: Employees have the right to join, or refrain from joining, employee unions. NASA recognizes the right of its employees to form, join, and assist any employee organization, or to refrain from any such activity, and to exercise these rights freely and without penalty or reprisal. This right also extends to participation in the management of the employee organization and to acting as an employee organizational representative, except where such activity would result in a conflict of interest with the official duties of an employee. FEDERAL EMPLOYEES HEALTH BENEFITS EXTENSION OF COVERAGE: The Federal Employees Health Benefits Amendments Act (PL 100-654) has provided separated employees, certain dependent children, and former spouses the option of keeping their Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) plan for specific periods of time. Under the provisions, employees who leave the Government, either voluntarily or involuntarily, are eligible to continue FEHB coverage for 18 months if (1) the employee was enrolled in the FEHB at time of separation; and, (2) the employee was NOT fired because of “gross misconduct.” This includes employees who retire and are not eligible to continue FEHB coverage as annuitants. Children who become age 22 and ex-spouses may continue coverage for up to 36 months provided they had coverage under a Federal employee at the time of the event. These individuals have continuation of coverage for 31 days at no cost to them. However, within 60 days of the event, they must submit paperwork to continue their FEHB. KSC/CCAFS HEALTH EDUCATION & WELLNESS PROGRAM SEPTEMBER 2004 ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION:

The month of September is dedicated to environmental health promotion. Two important topics chosen to be highlighted during this month are indoor air quality and hearing loss prevention. In the last several years, a growing body of scientific evidence has indicated that the air within homes and other buildings can be more seriously polluted than outdoor air. Since some research has found that we spend up to 90% of our time indoors, indoor air quality can have a significant impact on health. With regard to noise, repeated exposures to loud noise can lead to permanent, incurable hearing loss or tinnitus. Controlling noise from the workplace and the home whenever possible and using hearing protectors is critical for hearing loss prevention. This month’s information packet contains information addressing both of these important environmental health issues. 
