PRIVACY ACT NOTICE: Users are reminded that the Privacy Act requires any records that contain a Social Security Number or private information such as salary and medical records, must be kept in locked file drawers when unattended. It also requires that a NASA form 1534 be placed on top of all records subject to the Act. If mailed through the KSC Interoffice Mail System, KSC Form 13-242, A, B, or C, "Open by Addressee Only," must be used. (TA-E1)

CONFIDENTIAL FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE REPORT (OGE FORM) FILING: Those individuals reporting to a position for which there is a requirement for an initial and annual 450 filing are reminded the INITIAL filing must be completed no later than 30 days after reporting to that position. Forms are available from the Office of Chief Counsel by calling 867-2552. (CC)

MISUSE OF THE NASA INSIGNIA: Use of the computer templates, containing the NASA Insignia, for the production of NASA letterhead in electronic form is not authorized and should be removed from all computer systems. The Associate Administrator for Public Affairs has requested all NASA centers use only the printed NASA letterhead stationery. "The use of computer file NASA Insignias to custom design stationery provides opportunities for image manipulation and standards degradation which will adversely reflect the professional image of the Agency." If not approved for specific applications, electronic images of the NASA Insignia ("meatball") should be removed from computer systems. (IT-D1)

INSPECTOR GENERAL: The Office of Criminal Investigations (OCI) is the investigative arm of the NASA Inspector General (IG). The OCI is an independent entity and reports directly to Robert Cobb, the NASA IG, in Washington D.C. The primary mission of this component is to conduct criminal and civil investigations of reported or suspected fraudulent acts by employees, contractors, and others relating to the administration of NASA contracts and programs. Although emphasis is placed on major procurement fraud, (particularly allegations of defective/substandard parts, mischarging, kickbacks, bid rigging, and research fraud), investigations are also conducted of theft, conflict of interest, environmental and hazardous waste violations, health care fraud, and computer related crimes. OCI also provides fraud briefings for Government and contractor employees that are designed to highlight potential risks concerning fraud and related matters. Diabetes

Type 2 Diabetes is the most common form of diabetes accounting for 90% of the total 18 million diabetics in the United States. With Type 2 diabetes, the body does not use blood sugar effectively. Shockingly, a third of Type 2 diabetics are unaware they have the disease. Moreover, there are 41 million people in the United States who have "pre-diabetes." "Pre-diabetes" is a common stage before becoming diabetic. This is when blood glucose levels are higher than normal but not quite as high as a diabetic's blood glucose levels.

Both pre-diabetes and diabetes are frequently associated with weight gain and contributing health behaviors in adolescence and adulthood as well as genetic factors. This month's health information packet on diabetes addresses the risk factors, testing and prevention/control measures for pre-diabetes and diabetes. 


