**FEDERAL EMPLOYEE HEALTH BENEFITS FOR MILITARY RETIREES:** CHAMPUS coverage for military retirees is automatically transferred from CHAMPUS to Medicare coverage upon attaining the Medicare eligibility, at age 65. Employees have 31 days from the date of loss of CHAMPUS to enroll in a Federal Employees Health Benefit (FEHB) plan. Military retirees who are thinking about retiring from civilian service before reaching Medicare eligibility are reminded: to have FEHB coverage as retiree, an employee must be enrolled at the time of retirement; to insure coverage, they should enroll in an FEHB plan that takes effect before the retirement date elected. To keep FEHB after retirement, employees must be enrolled for at least 5 years; and coverage under CHAMPUS counts towards eligibility to carry FEHB into retirement. ##### **Diabetes**

Type 2 Diabetes is the most common form of diabetes accounting for 90% of the total 18 million diabetics in the United States. With Type 2 diabetes, the body does not use blood sugar effectively. Shockingly, a third of Type 2 diabetics are unaware they have the disease. Moreover, there are 41 million people in the United States who have "pre-diabetes." "Pre-diabetes" is a common stage before becoming diabetic. This is when blood glucose levels are higher than normal but not quite as high as a diabetic's blood glucose levels.

Both pre-diabetes and diabetes are frequently associated with weight gain and contributing health behaviors in adolescence and adulthood as well as genetic factors. This month's health information packet on diabetes addresses the risk factors, testing and prevention/control measures for pre-diabetes and diabetes. 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**COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING:** Small amounts of blood in your stool, which can be detected with hemocult slides, can be an indication of colorectal cancer. **NASA/JBOSC OUTBOUND SHIPMENTS:** To help ensure that all users of the JBOSC Shipping Department have their requirements met, the following procedure must be adhered to: Shipments processed through the JBOSC Shipping Department are for official government business only. Personal shipments are not authorized. All shipments must be accompanied by a properly completed shipping request document (KSC Form 7-248 or DD-1149). Carrier freight bills without the proper KSC forms will not be accepted. Shipments involving hazardous materials must have a Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) or other technical data sheet. Small priority/overnight shipments, including letters, must be received in the JBOSC Shipping Department no later than 2:00 pm or they will be processed on the following workday. Large priority shipments and/or shipments requiring extensive packaging must be received at least 48 hours prior to the required date at destination. Government property tagged items need to be routed through the proper Property Control Office before requesting the shipment and/or, if required, accompanied by a copy of a property custodian's approved KSC Form 1602. 
